I hope this email finds your summer off to a great start! As I approach the end of my first year with ITRR, I am filled with gratitude for the support, guidance, and trust everyone has shown me. I want to express my heartfelt appreciation for the opportunity to be a part of the incredible tourism and outdoor recreation industry in Montana.

As we near the end of the 2022-23 fiscal year, I would also like to take a moment to express my appreciation for the ITRR social scientists, our research partners, and the Tourism Advisory Council (TAC) for their hard work and dedication in producing a great year of research! As an Institute, we are committed to conducting and disseminating valid, reliable, and objective research designed to assist public agencies, businesses, and non-profit firms that provide visitor services or manage parks, recreation areas, and other facilities used by visitors to Montana. In addition, we utilize innovative approaches to data collection and analysis while continuously working on updating our interactive data portal and assisting with individual guidance/inquiries using these tools. In 2022, ITRR surveyed 7,496 nonresidents and 11,537 residents, which produces the ongoing quarterly economic, travel, and recreation analysis. A big shout out to our surveyors across the state that makes this possible, we can't thank them enough!

It was an active year of presentations as events returned to in-person. We presented to groups like the Society of American Foresters; Tourism Advisory Council; Montana Trails, Recreation, and Parks Association Conference; Governor's Conference on Tourism and Recreation; and various state chamber events, to name a few. In addition, I presented across the state, visiting seven cities with the Bureau of Business and Economic Research (BBER) for the 2023 <u>Outlook Seminar</u>, speaking to ~5,000+ people on the value and impact of tourism and outdoor recreation in Montana. Even better, I got a true Montana winter experience traveling in whiteouts on ice-covered roads, where I learned you don't drive over 50mph when you can't see the car ahead of you.

In 2022-23, we produced <u>15+ Publications, 12 interactive data</u> visualizations, and countless presentations. In addition, we received grant dollars to conduct research for the National Park Service (NPS), which is listed below. Our exceptional research reputation offers us these opportunities, which we are proud to be a part of. Below is an abbreviated list of our work.
